BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. There will be no private Baptisms. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.



PRAYER OF THE WEEK



Living My Faith... the Gifts of the Holy Spirit The solemnity of the Pentecost affords us the

opportunity to refresh our knowledge of the precious and priceless Gifts of the Holy Spirit, which we received when we were Baptized. At our Confirmation, we were sealed with these gifts, gifts that we need to lead the life that God has always had in mind for us. To fully appreciate these gifts, it is important that we understand them.

Wisdom: a gift of knowing what is good and just. Wisdom is not the same as intelligence; rather, wisdom is a gift of maturity, one that enables us to see things *not through our own eyes* but through those of God.

Understanding: a gift that enables us to be aware of God's working in our lives and to comprehend the Church's teachings.

Counsel: a gift of right judgment that enables us to clearly distinguish that which is right from that which is wrong and to apply that distinction to our actions and decisions.

Fortitude: a gift of courage that is built upon the gifts of wisdom and counsel. Once we know what is true and good, we have the ability to do the right thing and fight temptation.

Knowledge: a gift of knowing what God is asking of us, how He wants us to live. Rather than doing everything according to our own individual wills, we act according to the will of God.

Piety: a gift of fidelity to God. We are devoted to God and to our religion; therefore, we dutifully and happily commit to serving Him lovingly and worshipfully.

Fear of the Lord: the gift of reverence that is manifested in our overwhelming desire to please God and be close to Him always. We fear doing what displeases and offends Him. We long to show Him the utmost respect by honoring Him above all.

Our gratitude for the Gifts of the Holy Spirit is witnessed in our *using them "for our own good and the good of the Church."* Let this Pentecost Sunday be the day on which we recommit to doing so in a spirit of thanksgiving. **Come, Holy spirit, come!**
