Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

Reflection:

Am I too easily caught up in the materialism of our modern world?



Today's psalm bids us to seek wisdom. The gift of wisdom enables us to differentiate between wants and needs, pleasure and true joy, material possessions and the promised riches of Heaven.

We know that wisdom is one of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit that we received at our Baptism. Is this a gift that we need to remove from the bottom drawer of our heart, unwrap, and discover *its true value?*

Prompted by today's readings, we might take an internal inventory of the things that we most prize in life. Perhaps the adage "You can't take it with you" will come to mind as you make your list and focus on the *intangibles* that make you the person you are: a child of God.

During the early, darkest days of the pandemic, we were faced with shortages of everyday items. Confronted with the unwelcome notion of 'having to do without,' we began to take stock of the things that mean most to us. Good health, friendships, and family earned a higher ranking than the *things* that we had acquired throughout the years of our lives. We spent longer stretches of time within the confines of our homes, our sanctuaries from the virus that frightened us.

We also became more acutely aware of our personal relationship with God during these uncertain and troubling times. Our reliance on Him deepened despite our inability to be physically present for Mass in our beloved church. We longed to receive the Eucharist.

Unfortunately, sometimes it takes a crisis or some deprivation to make us realize what we really need. At such times, we realize the importance of being "rich in the matters of God." At such times, we would be wise to ask...
