SUNDAY REFLECTION

Today, in the Liturgy of the Word, we read the Passion of the Lord according to Saint Mark and hear testimony that leaves us stunned: "Truly, this man was the Son of God" (Mk 15:39). The evangelist takes great care in putting these words into the mouth of a Roman centurion who, astonished, had witnessed what would have been just another execution in his duty in a foreign and subdued country.

It must be hard to imagine what the centurion must have seen in Jesus' face – perhaps barely human looking - to utter such an expression. In one way or another, he must have discovered an innocent face, someone abandoned and perhaps betrayed, at the mercy of personal interests; or maybe someone who was the object of an injustice amidst an unjust society; someone who remains silent, endures, and even mysteriously accepts all the punishment inflicted on him. Perhaps, he could even feel himself complicit in an injustice before which he does not dare to do anything to oppose it, like so many others who wash their hands of other people's problems.

The image of that Roman centurion is the image of humanity that merely contemplates but does nothing. It is, at the same time, the profession of faith of a pagan. Jesus dies alone, innocent, beaten, abandoned, and yet trusting, with a deep sense of His mission, bearing the "remnants of love" that the blows have left on His body.

But earlier - on His entry into Jerusalem - they hailed Him as the One who comes in the name of the Lord (cf. Mk 11:9). Today's acclamation is not of an eager and ignorant expectation, as it was that day Jesus rode into Jerusalem. Rather, our acclamation is directed to the One who has already gone through the ordeal of total self-giving, and has emerged victorious. In the end, "It is ourselves that we must spread under Christ's feet, not coats or lifeless branches or shoots of trees, matter which wastes away and delights the eye only for a few brief hours. But we have clothed ourselves with Christ's grace, or with the whole Christ... so let us spread ourselves like coats under his feet." (Saint Andrew of Crete).

CATECHISM *of the* CATHOLIC CHURCH

Can we grasp God at all in concepts? Is it possible to speak about him meaningfully?

Although we men are limited and the infinite greatness of God never fits into finite human concepts, we can nevertheless speak rightly about God. [39-43, 48] In order to express something about God, we use imperfect images and limited notions. And so everything we say about God is subject to the reservation that our language is not equal to God's greatness. Therefore we must constantly purify and improve our speech about God.

During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "almsgiving," which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As a St. Ladislaus community, this year we are gathering donations for a commemorative plaque for Father Piotr Rozek to be placed on his grave in Poland. W okresie Wielkiego Postu jesteśmy proszeni, abyśmy w większym stopniu skupili się na „jałmużnie”, co oznacza przekazywanie pieniędzy lub dóbr biednym oraz wykonywanie innych dzieł miłosierdzia. Jako wspólnota św. Jadwigi w tym roku będziemy zbierać datki na tablicę nagrobną dla śp. Ks. Piotra Roźka.



KATECHIZM KOŚCIOŁA KATOLICKIEGO

Czy Boga w ogóle można zatrzymać w pojęciach? Czy można o Nim sensownie mówić?

Chociaż my, ludzie, jesteśmy w swoim pojmowaniu ograniczeni i nieskończona wielkość Boga nigdy nie da się ująć w skończonych ludzkich pojęciach, to jednak możemy mówić o Bogu prawdę. [39-43, 48] Mówiąc o Bogu, posługujemy się niedoskonałymi obrazami i ograniczonymi wyobrażeniami. Każe słowo o Bogu należy zatem wypowiadać z zastrzeżeniem, że nasz język nie dorasta do Jego wielkości. Dlatego nasze mówienie o Bogu musimy ciągle korygować i precyzować.

ROZWAŻANIE NA NIEDZIEŁĘ

Dzisiaj, w Liturgii Słowa czytana jest Męka Pańska według św. Marka, w której słyszymy niesamowite świadectwo: «Prawdziwie, ten człowiek był Synem Bożym» (Mk 15,39). Ewangelista zwraca uwagę na to, że te słowa wychodzą z ust setnika rzymskiego, który jest poruszony, pomimo tego, że uczestniczył już w tylu egzekucjach ze względu na swój pobyt w obcym, podległym kraju.

Niełatwo jest odpowiedzieć na pytanie, co takiego mógł zobaczyć na tej Twarz - nieludzko umęczonej - że zrobiła na nim takie wrażenie. Tak czy inaczej, prawdopodobnie poznał, że było to oblicze niewinne, oblicze człowieka opuszczonego i zdradzonego w imię czegoś własnego interesu, lub, że był to Ktoś, kto w milczeniu, w niepojęty sposób przyjmuje wszystkie cierpienia. Być może nawet poczuł, że jest współodpowiedzialny za niesprawiedliwość, gdyż nie kiwał palcem, aby jej zapobiec, podobnie jak inni umywają ręce od problemów bliźnich.

Obraz setnika rzymskiego to obraz ludzkości, która kontempluje, a zarazem wyznanie wiary poganina. Jezus umiera sam, niewinny, ubiczowany, opuszczony, ale jednocześnie pełen ufności i wiary w sens swojej misji oraz zachowujący „resztki miłości”, które pozostały w jego ciele

biczowania.

Wcześniej, podczas wjazdu do Jerozolimy, ludzie oklaskiwali Jezusa, uznając Go za Tego, który przychodzi w imię Pańskie (zob. Mk 11,9). Nasze tegoroczne uznanie Jezusa za Zbawiciela nie jest już tak niepewne, pełne iluzorycznej niewiedzy, jak reakcja mieszkańców Jerozolimy. Nasza aklamacja jest bowiem skierowana do Tego, który oddał samego Siebie i wyszedł z tego zwycięsko. Dlatego też: «Siebie samych ścielemy pokorne przed Chrystusem, a nie tuniki, martwe gałęzie i łodygi krzewów, które radują oczy jedynie przez parę godzin, a wraz z limfą tracą także zieleń. Obleczeni w Jego łaskę, czyli w Niego samego kładźmy się pod Jego nogi jak rozścieralone tuniki» (św. Andrzej, biskup Krety).



COMUNIDAD HISPANO

REFLEXIÓN PARA EL DOMINGO



Hoy, en la Liturgia de la palabra leemos la pasión del Señor según san Marcos y escuchamos un testimonio que nos deja sobrecogidos: «Verdaderamente, este hombre era Hijo de Dios» (Mc 15,39). El evangelista tiene mucho cuidado en poner estas palabras en labios de un centurión romano, que atónito, había asistido a una más de entre tantas ejecuciones que le debería tocar presenciar en función de su estancia en un país extranjero y sometido.

No debe ser fácil preguntarse qué debió ver en Aquel rostro -a duras penas humano- como para emitir semejante expresión. De una manera u otra debió descubrir un rostro inocente, alguien abandonado y quizás traicionado, a merced de intereses particulares; o quizás alguien que era objeto de una injusticia en medio de una sociedad no muy justa; alguien que calla, soporta e, incluso, misteriosamente acepta todo lo que se le está viendo encima. Quizás, incluso, podría llegar a sentirse colaborando en una injusticia ante la cual él no mueve ni un dedo por impedirla, como tantos otros se lavan las manos ante los problemas de los demás.

La imagen de aquel centurión romano es la imagen de la Humanidad que contempla. Es, al mismo tiempo, la profesión de fe de un pagano. Jesús muere solo, inocente, golpeado, abandonado y confiado a la vez, con un sentido profundo de su misión, con los "restos de amor" que los golpes le han dejado en su cuerpo.

Pero antes -en su entrada en Jerusalén- le han aclamado como Aquel que viene en nombre del Señor (cf. Mc 11,9). Nuestra aclamación este año no es de expectación, ilusionada y sin conocimiento, como la de aquellos habitantes de Jerusalén. Nuestra aclamación se dirige a Aquel que ya ha pasado por el trago de la donación total y del que ha salido victorioso. En fin, «nosotros deberíamos prosternarnos a los pies de Cristo, no poniendo bajo sus pies nuestras túnicas o unas ramas inertes, que muy pronto perderían su verdor, su fruto y su aspecto agradable, sino revistiéndonos de su gracia» (San Andrés de Creta).


STATIONS of the CROSS
