

#### **BAPTISM:**

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated during the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. There will be no private Baptisms. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.



## Faith Facts ~ This Week in the Church Calendar

- Saint Bernard, Abbot and Doctor of the Church~ (also known as Bernard of Clairvaux, the site of his monastery in France) Saint Bernard was the founder and superior (hence, the title Abbot) of the Cistercians, a religious order of monks that followed the rules of Saint Benedict. Bernard was a dynamic preacher whose love of Christ prompted religious revivals in 12th century Europe and brought thousands of people to repent of their sins and turn to God's grace. His preaching and writings resulted in the founding of more than fifty monasteries in Europe. Bernard was the first Cistercian to be canonized. The title of Doctor of the Church is applied to him because of his great learning, his ecclesiastical writings, and his holy life.
- Saturday, August 22: The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary ~ This feast was established in 1954 by Pope Pius XII. Actually, Mary's (coronation) queenship was foretold in chapter 12 of Revelation with the following words: "And a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon was under her feet, and upon her head a crown of twelve stars. One of the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary is the Coronation of Mary.

## Stewardship

Good stewards of the faith hear the call and then heed the call. They understand that God has bestowed on them gifts that can be used for the good of others. As faithful stewards, however, we are sometimes hindered from recognizing our gifts because of our sense of humility. Humility is not meant to be a deprecation of self as heard in statements such as, "I'm not good at anything." A belittling of our gifts might lead to our not using them. God has bestowed a gift on each of us. We can recognize our gift and use it for good while remaining humble by acknowledging that *God is the giver of that gift*.

As good stewards of our faith, we are called to share our gift. The gift might be a talent that we can share with members of our family or community. We think of musicians who offer to perform for no fee in an effort to raise funds for those in need. An avid reader might volunteer to work with children who don't read well. Someone who likes to cook might make a meal for an elderly person.

If there is something good to be said of this pandemic, it is that many who have heard the call have also heeded the call. Think of the scores of crafters who have made masks for first responders. Think of the chefs who have delivered meals to those who couldn't leave home to go to the market. Think of those who consider themselves to be good hosts or hostesses and have put that talent to use in planning socially-distanced celebrations for friends and loved ones. Indeed, the list of ways in which we have witnessed others heeding the call could go on for pages.

When you receive a gift from someone, the giver of that gift is overjoyed to see you use it. How hurtful to the giver it would be to let that gift sit in a box on a remote shelf instead of being unwrapped and used. Let us pray that as gifted stewards, we seek to "unwrap" our gifts from God and use them to serve our parish family, our community, and beyond.
