

BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated during the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. There will be no private Baptisms. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.



Dear University Students of Long Island

So much has changed in the world since last semester, and so much will be different on campus this year. Yet one thing remains: the love of Jesus Christ. Whether you are navigating long distance learning or returning to a campus on Long Island or a campus in another part of the country, entering as a transfer student or just beginning, the Holy Spirit calls you to live in this love. The Holy Spirit desires spiritual greatness from you right in the midst of the heavy crosses the world is carrying.

As the year begins, I would like to offer you some short words of advice as you strive for holiness in this unique moment of history. Know that each one of you is daily in my prayers and Masses along with your family and every friend you make on campus.

- First, be radically faithful to the Sunday Mass.
- Pray daily.
- Embrace and live the Ten Commandments given to us by God.
- Have a deep devotion to the Holy Spirit.
- Serve generously.
- Sanctify your daily academic work.
- Build authentic friendships.
- Learn to articulate the Catholic Faith by cultivating the art of Catholic Apologetics.
- Explore the work of Catholic Intellectuals.
