BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated during the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. There will be no private Baptisms. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.



PRAYER of the WEEK

Almighty and ever-living God, Who created us in Your image and called us to be saints, strengthen our resolve to do what is just, what is good, what is right. Help us to grow in mercy so that our practice of forgiveness serves as an example to others

and works to spread peace. Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, Your Son, Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.

Reflection: Today's first reading, psalm, and Gospel focus on forgiveness. The dominant mention of pardon and forgive speak loudly and clearly about the need for all of us to not "nourish anger." This is a challenge for most of us, true? Probably everyone at some point in his/her life has been hurt by an unkind word or an act of cruelty. Some of these hurts really sting, but the sting only grows more painful if our feeling of anger is allowed to fester within us. The first reading uses the words "cherishes wrath" for those who refuse to let go of their anger toward another. This implies that the person who has been offended gets some satisfaction in holding onto hurt feelings. Let's consider for a moment: How would we feel if we asked God for forgiveness, and we were denied mercy? As we hear in today's reading from the Book of Sirach, "Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the Lord? Could anyone refuse mercy to another like himself, can he seek pardon for his own sins?"

The world is in sore need of mercy. Sadly, it seems that anger is running rampant. Let us pray for a conversion of those hearts that are heavy with hurt, burdened with bitterness...may those hearts open and allow the Lord to enter. After all, it is the Lord who "pardons all iniquities and heals all ills."
