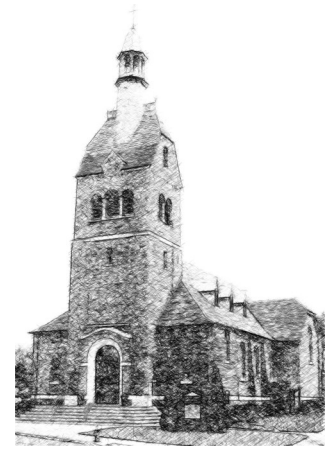

BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES:

Arrange *at least* six months before time.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.

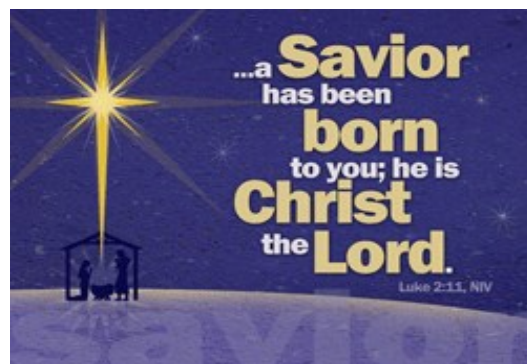

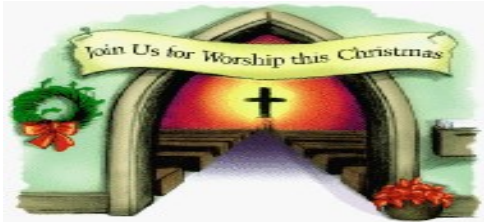

The Creche~ A Beloved Catholic Tradition

During this holy season of Advent, we look forward to the presence of the Creche, the Nativity Scene, at our church altar. In the earliest days, the depictions of the Christ Child in the manger were found only *inside* churches. The placement of the crib outside of the church and the expansion of the manger scene to include animals can be attributed to none other than Saint Francis of Assisi.

We associate Saint Francis with a denial of riches; therefore it comes as no surprise that St. Francis did not favor the extravagant manner in which Christmas was celebrated. His preference for a humbler image of the scene at Bethlehem inspired him to seek a friend who provided a simple, rustic crib with hay and live animals. The Pope approved of Francis' innovative idea. As a result, when the prayerful pilgrims went to the Italian village of Greccio on Christmas Eve in the year 1223, they were delighted with the beautiful simplicity of the manger scene. We can imagine the crowds of worshipers bearing candles and torches under a night sky as they gazed in joy and wonder at Francis's creche.

The presence of a creche in a prominent place in our homes prompts prayer and quiet reflection. It is a tradition to treasure and pass on to our children.
