BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.

The Saints...Seekers of Holiness

This week we celebrate two saints who may not be familiar to some. **Saint Jerome Emiliani** and **Saint Josephine Bakhita** lived worlds and centuries apart, yet these two holy people shared the unfortunate chains of imprisonment. **Jerome** was a prisoner of war who became aware that his real dungeon was the spiritual void in which he had lived. His true freedom came when he realized that he needed God. Jerome used his ultimate freedom to help the poor, especially orphans. **Josephine Bakhita** was a Sudanese woman who was kidnapped as a child and sold into the brutal world of slavery. She endured years of physical suffering as well as deprivation of any kindness. Years later Josephine was put in the care of an order of nuns in Italy, and from that time on, she knew and spread true joy. Both of these brave souls were able to free themselves from their cruel environs and find solace in the world of peace offered by our heavenly Father. Both were able to shed the chains of personal suffering and commit themselves to serving others. Both knew the love that *endures all things*.

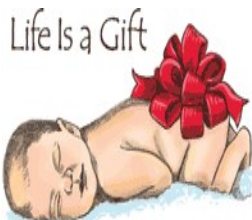
