BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month.

Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.*

Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.

Prayer of the Week

Today we light the first candle on the Advent wreath. This candle is the Candle of Hope. Jesus is the hope of the world, the hope of all nations.





Today marks the beginning of the beautiful season of Advent. The word Advent, which comes from the Latin for “coming,” is applied

to this four-week period of waiting for the coming of Jesus. While we prepare for His birth with hearts of love and gladness, we also anticipate Jesus’ Second Coming when “He will come again in glory.”

While we are understandably busy with preparations for the celebration of Christmas, let us remember to prepare our hearts for the Lord’s coming. Let us focus on the true meaning of Christmas by spending precious time in prayer and the reading of Scripture. As we think of gift giving, let us be prompted to perform acts of charity for others, those whom we know and those strangers who are in need of kindness.

Advent has been described as being two-fold in character. It is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, during which we remember the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity. At the same time, it is a time when our hearts and minds are led to anticipating Christ’s Second Coming at the end of time. These two characteristics make Advent a period of “devout and expectant delight.”



The age-old tradition of sending Christmas cards can be made even more special. Perhaps you will

enhance this custom by saying a prayer for each person/family to whom you send a card. That way, your card becomes a *Godsend!*
