BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated during the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in Website: www.stladislaus.church English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. There will be no private Baptisms. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

A Steward Saint.....Saint Joseph

Yesterday was the feast day of Saint Joseph, foster-father of Jesus. Despite the lack of recorded dialogue in the Gospels, Saint Joseph teaches us many things. Foremost, this saint trusted God -simply, joyfully, wholeheartedly-in marrying Mary, in naming Jesus, in shepherding the precious pair to Egypt, in bringing them to Nazareth. Throughout the undetermined number of years of quiet faith and courage, Joseph *trusted*.

During Lent, we should be creating quiet time to reflect on how we *live our faith*. Some of your introspection should focus on the word **trust**. Do you practice the same trust that Joseph did? Perhaps you have a satisfying job, enjoy good health, and seemingly have everything under control. There is an old song aptly titled "Into Each Life Some Rain Must Fall." What happens when the storms come? Do you put your trust only in yourself?

At some point, we all realize that we cannot control everything. At some point, we need to "let go, and let God." Saint Joseph also faced huge problems but carried out his vocation with complete fidelity.

As stewards of our faith, we are called to lead by example. Let others see that when the storms come, we anchor ourselves with trust in God. As Saint Joseph is a model for us, so we need to be models for others, especially our young people. Parents are to show their children that their faith means everything to them. Statistics show that children who grew up with parents who attended Mass regularly were more likely to continue in their faith than those who did not. Today, more than ever, our world needs strong parents who bravely model their faith by complete trust in God. *St. Joseph, please intercede for us parents as we aim to become the role model God intended us to be!*
