BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends.

Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.

Did you know? This Sunday, May 22, is Maritime Day. It is a national day of prayer and remembrance for mariners and people of the sea, including but not limited to, U. S. Merchant Marines, fishermen, those who work at ports, those who operate boats, chaplains on boats, etc. As Catholics, our minds naturally drift to the many Gospel stories that take place in or near the sea. We think of the disciples who worked as fishermen until they assumed the vocation of "fishers of men."

Due to the power of the ocean, there is always an element of risk associated with any occupation or service related to the sea. It is therefore fitting that a familiar image related to things nautical is the anchor. The anchor is a symbol of support, a symbol of hope. We are a people of hope.



Those whose livelihood is linked to the sea are also devoted to **Stella Maris, the Star of the Sea.** These terms refer to Mary, our Blessed Mother. The Virgin Mary is called upon to calm storms. Of course, we whose lives are centered on land, call upon our Blessed Mother to calm our *inner storms*.
