Saints ~ Models of Faith

Perhaps you will find some time to read more about these and the other saints whose feasts are commemorated this week.

St. Vincent de Paul—It is likely that Vincent's growing up in a family of peasants was responsible for his lifelong commitment to those living in poverty. He spent much of his life ministering to the poor, providing them with relief, preaching to them, and even opening hospitals to care for them. In addition, Father Vincent was a co-founder of the Daughters of Charity. It is no wonder that St. Vincent is the patron of all charitable societies and volunteers. **His life reminds us of our responsibility to the poor.**

Saint Michael, Archangel— St. Michael was considered the leader of all the angels and is referred to as the "Prince of the Heavenly Host." We think of him as a warrior angel who fought with Satan. In the prayer to St. Michael, we ask him to be our protector against the "wickedness and snares of the devil." **He reminds us of the need to be aware of evil and to rely on God and His goodness to overcome its presence in the world.** We can also think of Saint Michael when we are faced with the need to fight off temptations that are harmful to our soul.

Saint Therese of the Child of Jesus—Saint Therese is commonly referred to as the 'Little Flower.' A small, frail girl, she was aware of her limitations. Instead of focusing on the large things that she could not do for God, she lived her life doing little things, making small sacrifices, and quietly performing little acts of kindness. She considered doing the most mundane and menial chores to be a way of showing her love for God. **The life of Saint Therese can inspire us to imitate her humility.**



Next Sunday, October 2, is Respect Life Sunday. We are reminded of the assaults on human dignity that come in many forms. The Respect Life Office is charged with deepening our already strong commitment to pro-life activities and parish education. Gospel Reflection: The sin of the rich man in today's parable was not that he was rich, but that he failed to share his wealth with the beggar at his gate. He knew Lazarus, walked by him every time he came in or out, but did nothing to relieve his suffering. Is there a Lazarus in my life? *Let us pray that we will never be fearful to act upon the Lord's call to care for the needs of the poor.*
