BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends. Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members.*

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.

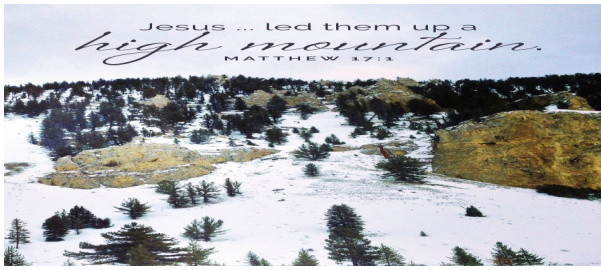
Pope Francis's prayer intention for August:

For World Youth Day~ We pray that the World Youth Day in Lisbon will help young people to live and witness the Gospel in their own lives.



Today's Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is one of the five most significant events in the Life of Jesus. (The other four are the Baptism of Christ, the Crucifixion, the Resurrection, and His Ascension.) When Jesus climbed the mountain with Peter, James, and John, He was *transfigured*, His face becoming luminous and His garment becoming dazzling white. The Transfiguration is the event that celebrates the revelation of Christ's divine glory. When Pope Saint John Paul II introduced the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary, he included the Transfiguration as one of them.





Gospel READING

In today's Gospel, we read about the voice from a cloud that said, "This is my beloved Son...listen to Him." God asks

us not merely to *hear*, but to listen. Listening involves effort on our part. We choose a quiet place and time free from distractions. We take in God's Word and focus on it, using our minds to absorb the message and apply it to our lives. Our heart is touched by a sense of peace when we recognize God's love for us within the Word. We sit quietly and allow His Word to resonate within us. Such is prayer...not just speaking, but truly listening to God, Who *always* listens to us.

Saint Clare: A Life of Holiness

This Friday we celebrate the feast day of Saint Clare. Clare was born in Assisi, Italy, into a noble and wealthy family. Rejecting the life of a woman of wealth and nobility, she became one of the first followers of another Assisi native, Francis. Inspired by Francis of Assisi, Clare founded a monastic religious order for women. Not surprisingly, her order was based on the Franciscan tradition. The formal name of her order was the Order of Poor Ladies, but they became known as the "Poor Clares." The order was committed to prayer, penance, and service. Clare, embracing a life of poverty, believed that her order of nuns should follow a life of poverty. She refused to accept any possessions for herself or for her convent. Clare saw the sacredness in each person, clearly aware that each person's value was not based on what he or she owned.

A Prayer to Saint Clare:

God of Mercy, You inspired Saint Clare with the love of poverty. By the help of her prayers, may we follow Christ in poverty of spirit and come to the joyful vision of Your glory in the kingdom of Heaven. Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, Your son, Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.
