BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

Saints ~ Models of Faith

This week we celebrate the feast day of **Saint Therese of the Child Jesus**. Her world was small in scope, but her quiet life of humility teaches us much about living as a disciple of Christ. How true that the small and often overlooked often bring a message of goodness that speaks to the world!

At some point, many of us realize that *simplicity* and *beauty* are not disparate concepts; hence, we have the phrase “simply beautiful.” This phrase definitely describes Saint Therese of the Child Jesus, commonly referred to as the “Little Flower.” In an age of selfies and other indulgences given to publicize oneself and one's deeds, it is instructive to focus on Therese, who preferred obscurity. A small, frail girl, Therese was well aware of her limitations. Instead of focusing on the large things that she could *not* do for God, she committed herself to doing little things. She made little sacrifices, quietly performing small acts of kindness. Therese said, “To pick up a pin for love can convert a soul.” She considered doing the most mundane and menial chores to be a way of showing her love for God. **Her life was one of service to God and others. It was a life beautiful in its simplicity. What a model of**

faith for us!

Reflection: Do I perform small acts of kindness and sacrifice at home, work, or school? Do I keep the performance of those deeds to myself and offer them up to God?
