BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends. Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM (Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (Note: Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish where they are registered members.





The Saints...Seekers of Holiness

The two saints whom we commemorate this Friday, October 28, Saint Jude Thaddeus and Saint Simon the Zealot, were chosen by Jesus to be Apostles. They both remained faithful to Jesus their whole lives, exemplifying piety, humility, and obedience. Both traveled and preached the Gospel. Both were martyrs. Saint Jude is the patron saint of hopeless cases, causes, and situations. Statues of Saint Jude have a small flame over his head, which is thought to represent the Holy Spirit. Saint Simon was known for his strict adherence to the Jewish teachings and laws, thus the description as a zealot. Not much is known about him. He is the patron saint of woodcutters, leather workers, and tanners.


