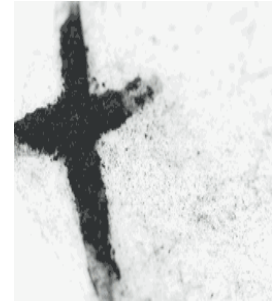

## BAPTISM:

**The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends.**

Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM (Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note: Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.*) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members.*

**MARRIAGES:** Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

English: after 9:00 AM Mass

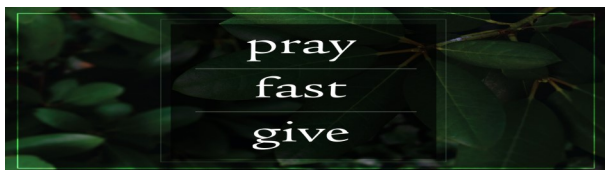
Polish: 7:00 PM

**CROSS** *Let us pray together as we join Jesus on His journey to the Cross.*

**Guidelines pertinent to the Lenten practices of abstinence and fasting:**

- ◆ All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to **abstain entirely** from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.
- ◆ All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from the fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.



The waters of Baptism make us part of the new covenant in Christ. May

this Lent be for each of us a time of renewal of our commitment to our faith, reinforcement of our Catholic beliefs, and repentance for the times we turned away from God's love. *Help us, Lord, to fight those temptations that distance us from You.*
