## BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 10:30AM Polish Mass, or 11:45 Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish)** is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

**October:** Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

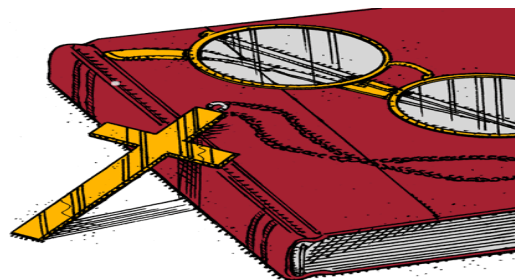

Dear Parishioners,

You may have noticed that there are frequently a number of weekday Masses with no specified Mass intention. I would like to invite you to consider having at least *one Mass a year* offered for one of your personal intentions. Some people may think that Masses are offered solely for the deceased. True, most of the Masses offered throughout the year are for the repose of the souls of deceased persons; indeed, one of the Corporal Works of Mercy is to “*bury the dead,*” which does in fact involve *praying for the dead.*

I politely remind you that Masses can be offered for numerous intentions; on the occasion of a birthday, graduation, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, or marriage. Parishioners often request that Masses be offered for the recovery or wellbeing of someone dealing with illness. Others offer masses of thanksgiving upon the birth of a child or some other blessed event. I believe that each parishioner has at least *one* intention that merits having a Mass offered. By having a Mass offered, you are actually performing an act of charity.

Each church in the Diocese asks for \$20 per Mass intention. You can arrange to have a Mass offered by speaking with me after Mass or by calling the secretary during the rectory office hours. She will write out a card for you to send to the person or family on whose behalf the Mass is being offered.

When we think of the amount of money we spend on flowers or other gifts, \$20 for the beautiful gift of a Mass is definitely money well spent. Such a gift enriches the giver and the recipient.
