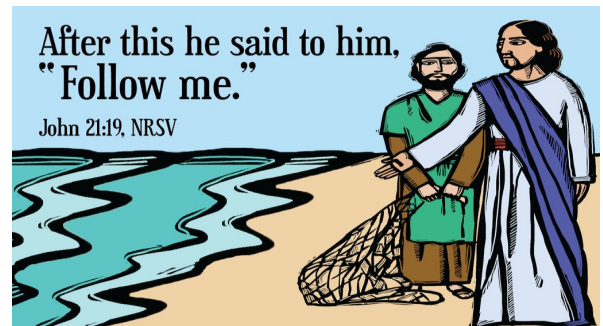
Prayer of the Week
