BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES:

Arrange *at least* six months before time.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Zale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.

What a beautiful feast this is! On this day, we are reminded of the priceless gifts that we received at Baptism...the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. When we were confirmed, we were sealed with these gifts, which prepared us for our lifelong faith journey. These gifts furnish us with what we need to live the life that God has in mind for us. Today let us recharge these spiritual tools so that we, like the apostles, are ready to spread God's message throughout our world.

Wisdom: a gift of knowing what is good and just, not solely for today, but for always. Being wise is not to be confused with being smart, which has to do with the acquisition of facts. Wisdom is a gift of maturity, one that enables us to see things not through our own eyes or those of the world, but through those of God.

Understanding: a gift that enables us to be aware of God's working in our lives and to comprehend the Church's teachings.

Counsel: a gift of right judgment that enables us to clearly distinguish right from wrong and to apply that distinction to our actions and decisions.

Fortitude: a gift of courage that is built upon the gifts of wisdom and counsel. Once we know what is true and good, we have the ability to do the right thing and fight temptation.

Knowledge: a gift of knowing that is not reflected on a report card! As our relationship with God deepens, we know what He is asking of us, how He wants us live. Rather than doing everything according to our individual wills, we act according to the will of God.

Piety: a gift of fidelity to God. We are devoted to God and to our religion and therefore dutifully and happily commit to serving Him lovingly and willingly.

Fear of the Lord: the gift of reverence that is manifested in our overwhelming desire to please God and be close to Him always. We fear doing what displeases and offends Him.



The gifts that we truly appreciate are the gifts that we use. These God-given gifts are not to be put away and forgotten. They are to be shared.
