## BAPTISM:

**The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month.** Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

**October:** Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

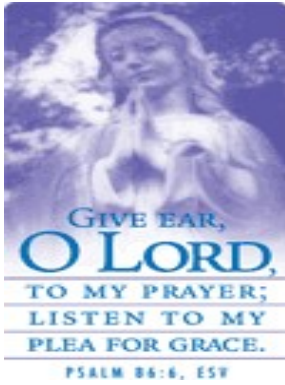
## PRAYER of the WEEK

Remember that Masses can be offered for numerous intentions: on the occasion of a birthday, graduation, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, or marriage. Most of the Masses offered throughout the year are for the repose of souls of deceased persons. Parishioners often request that Masses be offered for the recovery or wellbeing of someone dealing with illness. Others offer masses of thanksgiving upon the birth of a child or some other blessed event. Please consider having at least one Mass a year offered for one of your personal intentions. By having a Mass offered, you are actually performing an act of charity.

Each church in the Diocese asks \$20 per Mass intention. When we think of the amount of money we spend on flowers or other gifts, \$20 for the beautiful gift of a Mass is definitely money well spent. Such a gift enriches the giver and the recipient.



Something small and seemingly insignificant can yield something remarkable! Think of how a small act of kindness, a word of encouragement, a nod of approval, or a simple smile can yield wondrous fruits. Never suppress a respectful word or charitable deed! 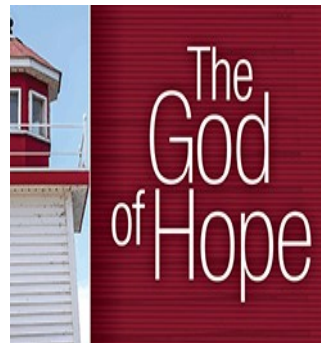
