BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.

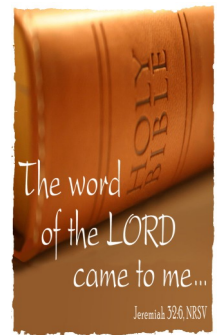

Blessings to all God's people at Saint Ladislaus Church

On March 29, 2020, the volcano La Soufriere in the island of St. Vincent became active. Although the volcano had been dormant since 1979, it started spewing smoke and actively rumbling. It blanketed St. Vincent in a layer of ash, forcing some 16,000 residents to evacuate their homes to cruise ships and safer parts of the island. We believe that our ministry is being called to action.

On April 11, 2021, the Cathedral at St. Agnes welcomed Bishop Andrzej Zglejszewski to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. In his homily, Bishop Andrzej reminded us of the history and mission of Divine Mercy Sunday. The apparitions of Jesus Christ received by St. Faustina were to make the faithful aware of the merciful love of God manifested through the passion and resurrection of our Savior. The gospel of that day told the story of the appearance of Jesus in the upper room where the disciples were hiding behind a locked door. His first word to them was "PEACE." He knew that they were not there with Him at Calvary and still, He said to them, "PEACE. All is well." Jesus shared with the disciples His MERCY, His FORGIVENESS as He opened His heart. His love is everlasting.

Today we are called to be a people of compassion. We are not there with the people of St. Vincent who are in turmoil, yet we know that we must do something. The St. Ladislaus Ministry to Catholics of African Ancestry is blessed to have received a grant that will allow us to reach out to the people of St. Vincent. We will send to St. Vincent an offering that we hope will help convey to the people the assurance of God's love and mercy. Brother to Brother and Sister to Sister, we say to them, "PEACE." We ask that you please pray for the people of St. Vincent as our ministry continues to pray for them and the people of St. Ladislaus.
