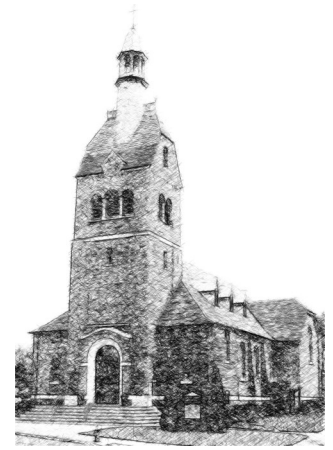

## BAPTISM:

**The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month.** Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

**MARRIAGES:** Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

## DEVOTIONS:

**May:** Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

**October:** Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

**Lent:** Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.

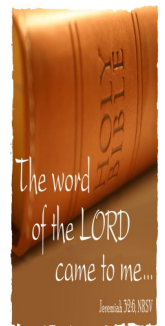

This Friday, June 11, is the Solemn  
Feast of **The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus**.  
This feast comes nineteen days after  
Pentecost Sunday on the liturgical calendar.  
From the time of the Apostles, this feast has  
been observed to show devotion to the Most  
Sacred Heart of Jesus. In the 17th century,  
Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque (Fr.)  
experienced a vision of Jesus, during which  
our Lord requested of her a special devotion  
to His Sacred Heart. Since then, this feast  
has been recognized worldwide. It is related  
to the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and  
Blood of Christ, which we celebrate today,  
and to The Immaculate Heart of Mary (June  
12). Images of the Sacred Heart of Jesus  
remind us His divine love for all of humanity.

*Living My Faith...Reverence*

Corpus Christi Sunday presents the perfect opportunity to consider our personal reception of the Eucharist. We reflect on the instruction that we received many years ago prior to receiving our First Holy Communion. We remember being told to approach the altar reverently with our hands folded; that is easy enough, true? We should also have our minds on what we are about to receive: the Body of Christ. The beauty and magnitude of this sacrament is overwhelming, and we remind ourselves of this by focusing on what we are to receive. We approach the priest and bow or genuflect. When we respond to the priest's words, "The Body of Christ," our "Amen" should be both audible and heartfelt. When we return to our seats, we should express gratitude for the great gift of the Eucharist. (We should never receive and leave!)



As disciple stewards, we pray that we remain ever aware of our dependence

on the Eucharist to nourish and sustain us. May we receive the Body of Christ and become the Body of Christ through our weekly reception of the Eucharist.
