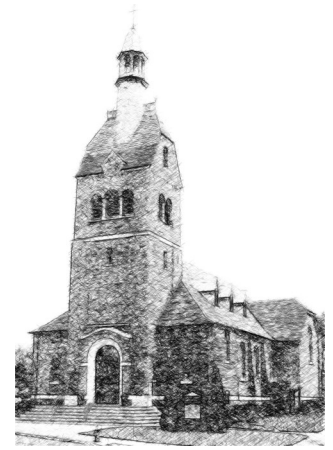

BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 PM in English, 7:30 PM in Polish. Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30AM Polish Mass.

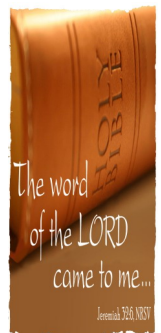

Living My Faith... Reverence

As we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity, it is good to reflect on the significance of the Sign of the Cross. Indeed, the Sign of the Cross identifies us as Catholics. By blessing ourselves thusly, we acknowledge our precious faith. When we dip our fingers into the holy water and then bless ourselves, we are reminded of our Baptism...our initiation into the Catholic faith.

Although we begin and end our prayers by signing ourselves, the Sign of the Cross is a prayer in itself. That understanding prompts us to reflect on the manner in which we bless ourselves.

By doing something repeatedly over time, we tend to do it automatically, without thought. Something done habitually is often done hurriedly. Shouldn't a prayer be said deliberately, carefully? From the time we were youngsters, we learned to enter the church, dip our right hand into the holy water font, and begin our worship with the Sign of the Cross. Our slow and deliberate actions signal us to the fact that we have come to church with a purpose. We have closed the door on our temporal world and are prepared to give God our full attention. **The Sign of the Cross serves as a 'spiritual summons' to a serious communication with God.** Today, as we focus on the Holy Trinity, let us commit to offering this beautiful prayer with serious consideration and reverence.
