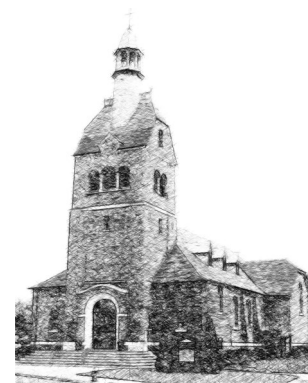

BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. In order to receive a Sponsorship Certificate required by all Godparents, prospective Godmothers and Godfathers must be registered and supporting parishioners of Saint Ladislaus Church. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.
Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30 AM Polish Mass.

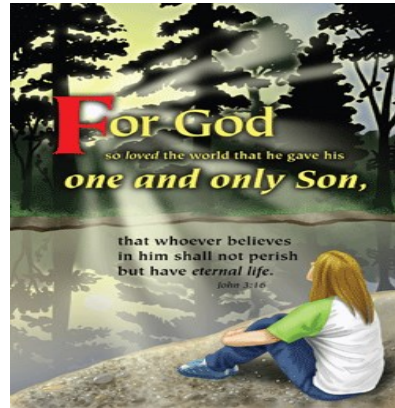
Living my faith as a Lenten pilgrim... On Ash Wednesday, we resolved to make an effort to pray more. As we begin the fourth week of Lent, it is a good time to consider how we are doing in finding time for prayer. Certainly our intentions are sincere, but in our busy, task-filled lives, praying can often become something we meant to do but just couldn't find the time to accomplish.

Praying can and should be a part of our daily routine. If we find time to call our friends and talk with them about our pleasures and pains, shouldn't we be able to talk to God about the same things? After all, He knows us better than our family or friends know us. He **always** has time for us.

Just as we stop whatever we are doing to talk to a family member or friend, so it should be with finding time to talk to God. Praying need not mean spending an hour a day on our knees, even though that would be time well-spent. Rather, we can all incorporate small prayers throughout the day. Our little, spontaneous prayers can express praise, petition, penance, or thanksgiving. Be mindful of and open to the **'prayer prompts'** that present themselves on a daily basis.

- ◆ Before we get out of bed in the morning, we can thank God for the day and **remind ourselves that we are in His presence.**
- ◆ As we eat breakfast or get dressed, we can ask God to watch over those dear to us. **Thank Him for the gift of family and friendship.**
- ◆ As we arrive at school or work, **we can ask help from the Holy Spirit.** We can pray for patience and wisdom in handling any challenge or crisis that the day may bring.
- ◆ **We can offer numerous silent prayers for those we encounter during the day.** These might be people with whom we work, gather socially, or even strangers we see who appear to be in need of prayer. Do you ever think of praying for those you see in the waiting room of the doctor's office? ...those in the ambulance that goes speeding by? ... the homeless person sitting on a curb? You need not look far to notice someone who would benefit from your prayer on his or her behalf.
- ◆ Just as we are quick to express thanks to others for even simple acts of kindness, we should find moments to **thank God for the many blessings we've been given.**
- ◆ At night, reflect on the day with gratitude. **Examine your conscience by asking yourself: "When did I love? When did I fail to love?"**

Why not use the remaining weeks of Lent to turn ordinary daily activities into precious moments with God our Father?



Mercy awaits us.

Scripture is rich in examples of God's love for us. This week's gospel provides a beautiful example of God's un-failing love and forgiveness. We might admit that there is likely something of the prodigal son in every one of us. When we turn to sin in order to do what we want to do, we insult God's gift of free will; however, God does not 'hold a grudge' or give up on us. Like the forgiving father in the story, God is waiting for us to return to Him. God is longing to greet each of us in Confession, to offer His embracing, forgiving love through the power of the sacrament of Penance.



This weekend we take up the Catholic Relief Services Collection. Our offerings will help the hungry as well as displaced refugees. By doing so, we will be helping Jesus in disguise.
