BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends.

Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.

Living our faith means using the gifts that we have been given. Let us reflect on the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit that we received at our Baptism.

- ◆ **Wisdom:** a gift of knowing what is good and just. Wisdom is a gift of maturity, one that enables us to see things not through our own eyes, but through those of God.
- ◆ **Understanding:** a gift that enables us to be aware of God's working in our lives and to comprehend the Church's teachings.
- ◆ **Counsel:** a gift of right judgment that enables us to clearly distinguish that which is right from that which is wrong and to apply that distinction to our actions and decisions.
- ◆ **Fortitude:** a gift of courage that is built upon the gifts of wisdom and counsel. Once we know what is true and good, we have the ability to do the right thing and to fight temptation.
- ◆ **Knowledge:** As our relationship with God deepens, we know what He is asking of us, how He wants us to live. Rather than doing everything according to our own individual wills, we act according to the will of God.
- ◆ **Piety:** a gift of fidelity to God. We are devoted to God and therefore dutifully and happily commit to serving Him lovingly and willingly.
- ◆ **Fear of the Lord:** the gift of reverence that is manifested in our overwhelming desire to please God and be close to Him always. We long to honor Him.



Reflection: Is the Holy Spirit guiding you to something today?



A **spiritual gift** is **given** to each of us so **we** can **help** each other.

Pentecost Sunday is a good day to take stock of the gifts each of us has been given. By using your gifts for others, you are allowing your faith to grow. People who share their talents are happy people.
