BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends.

Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.

Gospel Reading

Reflection: Saint Luke speaks to our use of two things with which we deal

daily: time and treasure (money). We often think that there is not enough of either; thus we recognize the need to structure our 'time management' and 'money management' when considering how to appropriate each. How many times have we complained, 'There aren't enough hours in a day?' How many times have we planned a budget, only to find that an unforeseen expenditure put us in the red?

Nowadays we hear much talk of planning for our financial futures, creating emergency funds, and making preparations for the "hour we do not expect." Such concerns are necessary and are made with the welfare of loved ones in mind. That being said, we also do not want to be spiritually unprepared when we are called to our heavenly home. After all, we won't be holding a bank statement when the Son of Man comes!

Today's Gospel prompts us to discover our true treasure and then to let our heart and our conscience direct how and when it will be used. The treasure we own may not be one with a dollar sign attached to it. Each of us has gifts that can bring happiness to others or lighten another's burden. Giving a gift of time to a friend who spends many hours alone can be priceless. Think of a talent you have and how that talent can be used to benefit another. Yes, you might have to sacrifice an hour that you had allotted for another activity, but you will feel better having done so. Reflect on the words of St. Paul: "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be."
