BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends.

Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.

Prayer of the Week

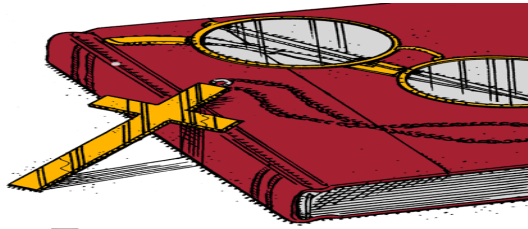

Reflection: In today's second reading, Saint Paul encourages us not to grow weary or lose heart, but to persevere in following Jesus. Our willingness to give of ourselves, even in the face of conflict and division, is one way to measure our discipleship.

THE SAINTS: MODELS OF FAITH

This Sunday, August 14th, marks the Memorial of **St. Maximilian Kolbe**, the Polish Catholic priest who, while a prisoner in the Auschwitz death camp, volunteered to sacrifice his life so that another prisoner might live. In his words, we read the power of his faith: "Let us remember that love lives through sacrifice and is nourished by giving. Without sacrifice, there is no love."

Another religious, whose memorial was last Tuesday, was **St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross**. Born Edith Stein to Jewish parents, she pursued a scholastic life and became a German Jewish philosopher. Inspired by the spiritual writings of St. Teresa of Avila, Edith converted to Christianity and became a Carmelite nun. Like St. Maximilian Kolbe, she was also a martyr who was killed in Auschwitz.
