BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends.

Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note:* Baptisms

during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members.*

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.

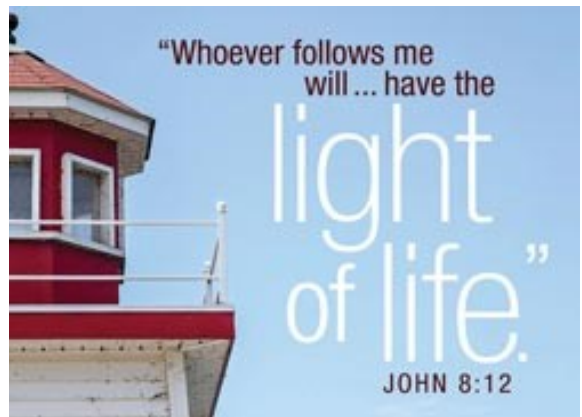

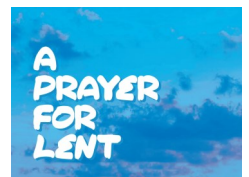

**MARCH 20: THE FEAST DAY
of SAINT JOSEPH**

As the spouse of Mary and the foster-father of Jesus, Saint Joseph was a true steward of his precious faith.

We can learn many things from Saint Joseph. Foremost, Joseph trusted God—simply, joyfully, wholeheartedly—in marrying Mary, in naming Jesus, in shepherding the precious pair to Egypt, in bringing them to Nazareth. Throughout an undetermined number of years of quiet faith and courage, Joseph *trusted*.

Let us ask ourselves: do we practice such trust? You may have a satisfying job, enjoy good health, and seemingly have everything under control. What happens when the storms come? Do you put your trust only in yourself? Do you escape to unhealthy activities to help ease the pain?

Saint Joseph also faced huge problems but carried out his vocation with complete fidelity. He patiently taught his foster-son to practice his Jewish faith, passed on its laws and customs, and helped Him learn the carpentry trade. Saint Joseph was a *conscientious* steward...of his traditions, his vocation, and his relationships.

Holy father Joseph, guardian of virgins, to whose faithful custody Christ Jesus, Innocence itself, and Mary, Virgin of virgins, were committed: I pray insistently and beseech you by these dear pledges, Jesus and Mary, that, being preserved from all uncleanness, I may with spotless mind, pure heart, and chaste body, ever most chastely serve Jesus and Mary all the days of my life. Saint Joseph, please intercede for us parents as we aim to become the role model God intended us to be. Amen.
