## BAPTISM:

**The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends.** Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members*.

**MARRIAGES:** Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

**October:** Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

**Lent:** Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.

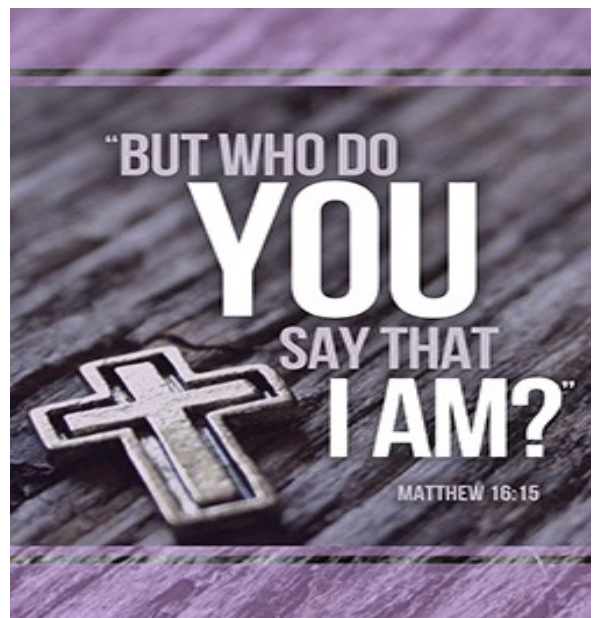

Our love for Jesus can be seen in how we love each other on earth.



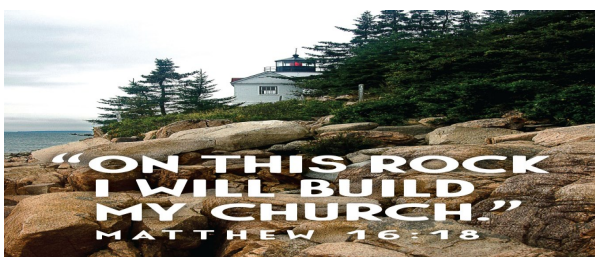
# Gospel Reading

By now we all know that Peter was assigned the distinction of being the rock on which the Church would be built. What an awesome and challenging task! Christ knew that He could count on Peter, a true disciple. We too are disciples, who, in our own seemingly small way, are able to continue to build up the Church by spreading *our* faith. You may ask, “How can I, one person, be responsible for spreading the faith?”

The disciples followed Jesus, prayed alongside Him, listened to Him, and observed how He interacted with others. Then they were able to go out into the world to spread the Good News of Jesus. We, as Baptized Catholics, have access to the Word and are able to receive the Body of Christ on a daily basis. We hear God’s message of love during every Mass.
