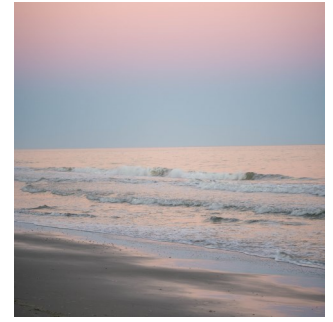

BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on weekends. Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass (Eng.), Sunday 8AM (Eng.) 9:30AM(Polish), or 4PM (Spanish). (*Note:* Baptisms during the 4PM Spanish Mass are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.) Parents who want to arrange a Baptism need to come to the rectory office and provide the child's birth certificate. Parents of first children are required to receive instruction prior to the baptism. Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. All Godparents need to obtain a document of sponsorship from the parish *where they are registered members.*

MARRIAGES: Arrange *at least* six months before the date.

DEVOTIONS:

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

Lent: Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 7:30 AM Mass in English; 7:30 PM in Polish.

Gorzkie Żale on Sundays in Lent following the 9:30 AM Polish Mass.

Scripture Reflection:

In today's second reading, St. Paul tells the Romans, "God's gifts and His call are irrevocable." To what is God calling me today? What gifts are mine to share? It is time for me to take an inventory of the gifts and skills that I have. Each of us is uniquely gifted and has a special role in building the Kingdom on earth. Let us pray that as gifted stewards, we seek to "unwrap" our gifts from God so that we can place them in service to our parish family and beyond.

Saints we commemorate this week:

Saint Pius X, Pope~ Because of the depth of his love for the Holy Eucharist, Pius X became known as the ‘Pope of the Blessed Sacrament.’ His fervent devotion to the Holy Eucharist was especially significant at a time when people generally received Holy Communion fewer than ten times a year. **Saint Pius X is the patron saint of First Communicants.**

Saint Rose of Lima~ Rose, whose name at birth was Isabel, was born to parents who were deeply devout Catholics. Their strong faith was passed on to their daughter. Rose grew to be a beautiful woman, but shunning vanity and thoughts of marriage, she longed to be a nun. Her mother did not allow her daughter to follow a religious vocation, and it was only after ten years that she permitted Rose to become a Dominican of the Third Order. As her parents did not permit her to live in a convent, Rose lived an ascetic, austere, prayer-filled, and semi-reclusive life in a hut on her family’s property. Nonetheless, she cared for the poor and sick who came to her for help. **Saint Rose of Lima is the patron saint of South America and the Philippines. She is also the patroness of those who do needlework and of gardeners and florists.**
