SUNDAY REFLECTION

Today, we recall how, at the beginning of the liturgical year, the Church prepared us for the first coming of Christ who brings us salvation. Two weeks from the end of the year, she prepares us for the second coming, the one in which the final and definitive word will be pronounced over each one of us.

In the face of today's Gospel, we can think "What a long term you are giving me," but "He is near" (Mk 13:29). And yet, in our society, it is annoying -even incorrect- to allude to death. However, we cannot speak of resurrection without thinking that we must die. The end of the world comes for each of us on the day we die, when the time given to us to choose will end. The Gospel is always Good News, and the God of Christ is the God of Life: why this fear; perhaps because of our lack of hope?

Faced with the immediacy of this judgment, we must learn to become severe judges, not of others, but of ourselves. We must not fall into the trap of self-justification, relativism or "I don't see it that way"... Jesus Christ gives us through the Church and, with Him, the means and resources so that this universal judgment is not the day of our condemnation, but a very interesting spectacle, in which, at last, the most hidden truths of the conflicts that have so tormented men will be made public.

The Church announces that we have a savior, Christ, the Lord. Less fear and more coherence in our actions with what we believe! St. J.H. Newman said "When we come into God's presence, we shall be asked two things, whether we were in the Church, and whether we worked in the Church. Everything else is worthless." The Church does not only teach us a way of dying, but a way of living in order to be resurrected. For what she preaches is not her message, but that of the One whose word is the source of life. Only from this hope will we face God's judgment with serenity.

CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

Who is the "Holy Spirit"?

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the HOLY TRINITY and has the same divine majesty as the Father and the Son. When we discover the reality of God in us, we are dealing with the working of the Holy Spirit. God sent "the Spirit of his Son into our hearts" (Gal 4:6), so that he might fill us completely. In the Holy Spirit a Christian finds profound joy, inner peace, and freedom. "For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the spirit of sonship [in whom] we cry, 'Abba! Father!' " (Rom 8:15b). In the Holy Spirit, whom we receive in Baptism and Confirmation we are permitted to call God "Father". The memory of this Father sheds light on our deepest human identity: where we come from, who we are, and how great is our dignity. Certainly we come from our parents, and we are their children, but we also come from God, who has created us in his image and called us to be his children. Consequently, at the origin of every human being there is not something haphazard or chance, but a loving plan of God. This was revealed to us by Jesus Christ, the true Son of God and a perfect man. He knew whence he came and whence all of us have come: from the love of his Father and our Father. POPE BENEDICT XVI

KATECHIZM KOŚCIOŁA KATOLICKIEGO

Kto to jest Duch Święty?

Duch Święty jest trzecią Osobą TRÓJCY ŚWIĘTEJ i ma taką samą naturę boską jak Ojciec i Syn. [243-248, 263-264] Gdy odkrywamy w sobie obecność Bożą, mamy do czynienia z działaniem Ducha Świętego. Bóg posłał „do naszych serc Ducha swego Syna” (Ga 4, 6), żeby nas całkowicie wypełnił. W Duchu Świętym chrześcijanin odnajduje głęboką radość, wewnętrzny pokój i wolność. „Nie przyjęliście przecież ducha niewoli, aby trwać w lęku, ale przyjęliście Ducha, który czyni was dziećmi. W Nim woła my: Abba, Ojczec!” (Rz 8, 15). W Duchu Świętym, którego otrzymujemy podczas chrztu i -> BIERZMOWANIA, możemy Boga nazywać Ojcem. -> 113-120,203-207,310-311

ROZWAŻANIE NA NIEDZIELE

Dzisiaj, wspominamy, jak na początku roku liturgicznego Kościół przygotowywał nas na pierwsze przyjście Chrystusa, który przynosi nam zbawienie. A na dwa tygodnie przed końcem roku przygotowuje nas na drugie przyjście, to, w którym wyrazi się ostatecznie i ostateczne słowo o każdym z nas.

O dzisiejszej Ewangelii możemy pomyśleć „hulaj duszą, piekła nie ma”, ale jednak «On jest blisko» (Mk 13,29). Ale mimo to, nie wypada, a w naszym społeczeństwie jest nawet niepoprawne!, odnosić się do śmierci. Ale my nie możemy mówić o zmartwychwstaniu, jeśli nie pomyślimy, że mamy umrzeć. Koniec świata zaczyna się dla każdego z nas w momencie jego śmierci, w momencie, w którym zakończył się dany nam czas wyboru. Ewangelia jest zawsze Dobrą Nowiną i Bóg Chrystusa jest Bogiem Życia: więc skąd ten strach?; czy nie przez nasz brak nadziei?

Wobec nieodwołalności tego sądu winniśmy być surowymi sędziami, lecz nie sędziami innych ludzi, ale nas samych. I nie wpaść w pułapkę samousprawiedliwienia, relatywizmu lub typowej postawy „ja to widzę tak”... Jezus Chrystus daje się nam w Kościele i wraz z Nim dane są nam środki, by ten uniwersalny sąd nie był dniem naszego skazania, lecz interesującym spektaklem, w którym publiczne staną się najskrytsze prawdy, które tak bardzo wstrząsały ludzkością.

Kościół ogłasza, że mamy zbawiciela w Chrystusie Panu. Mniej lęków i więcej konsekwencji w naszych działaniach zgodnych z naszą wiarą! «Kiedy staniemy w obecności Boga, zapyta nas o dwie rzeczy: czy byliśmy w Kościele i czy pracowaliśmy w Kościele; wszystko inne się nie liczy» (Święty J.H. Newman). Kościół nie tylko uczy nas pewnej formy umierania, ale uczy także sposobu życia, aby zmartwychwstać. Bo to, co przepowiada nie pochodzi od niego, ale od Tego, którego słowo jest źródłem życia. Tylko z taką nadzieją spokojnie przyjmujemy sąd Boga.

REFLEXIONES DEL EVANGELIO

Hoy, recordamos cómo, al comienzo del año litúrgico, la Iglesia nos preparaba para la primera llegada de Cristo que nos trae la salvación. A dos semanas del final del año, nos prepara para la segunda venida, aquella en la que se pronunciará la última y definitiva palabra sobre cada uno de nosotros.

Ante el Evangelio de hoy podemos pensar que “largo me lo fiais”, pero «Él está cerca» (Mc 13,29). Y, sin embargo, resulta molesto —¡hasta incorrecto!— en nuestra sociedad aludir a la muerte. Sin embargo, no podemos hablar de resurrección sin pensar que hemos de morir. El fin del mundo se origina para cada uno de nosotros el día que fallezcamos, momento en el que terminará el tiempo que se nos habrá dado para optar. El Evangelio es siempre una Buena Noticia y el Dios de Cristo es Dios de Vida: ¿por qué ese miedo?; ¿acaso por nuestra falta de esperanza?

Ante la inmediatez de ese juicio hemos de saber convertirnos en jueces severos, no de los demás, sino de nosotros mismos. No caer en la trampa de la autojustificación, del relativismo o del “yo no lo veo así”... Jesucristo se nos da a través de la Iglesia y, con Él, los medios y recursos para que ese juicio universal no sea el día de nuestra condenación, sino un espectáculo muy interesante, en el que por fin, se harán públicas las verdades más ocultas de los conflictos que tanto han atormentado a los hombres.

La Iglesia anuncia que tenemos un salvador, Cristo, el Señor. ¡Menos miedos y más coherencia en nuestro actuar con lo que creemos! «Cuando lleguemos a la presencia de Dios, se nos preguntarán dos cosas: si estábamos en la Iglesia y si trabajábamos en la Iglesia; todo lo demás no tiene valor» (San J.H. Newman). La Iglesia no sólo nos enseña una forma de morir, sino una forma de vivir para poder resucitar. Porque lo que predica no es su mensaje, sino el de Aquél cuya palabra es fuente de vida. Sólo desde esta esperanza afrontaremos con serenidad el juicio de Dios.

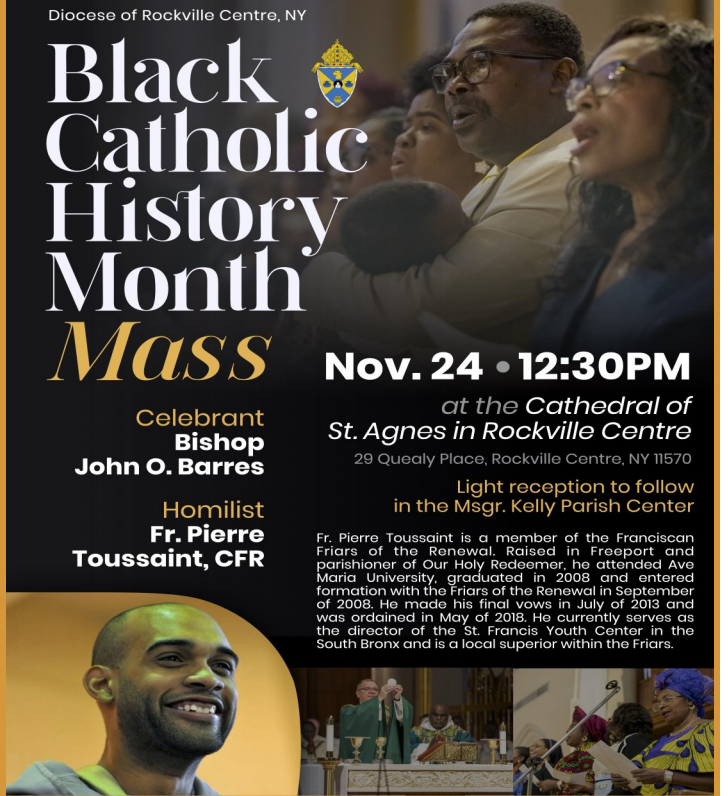
