Dear Friends, As we celebrate the entire Easter season Long Island, we remember the power of the Risen Christ so eloquently captured in the Resurrection narratives of the four Gospels.

It is my role as your Bishop, as your successor to the Apostles on Long Island, and as your servant, to be a teacher of prayer.
