BAPTISM:

The sacrament of Baptism (English, Polish) is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th weekends of the month. Because our parish family is welcoming a new member to our faith community, Baptisms will be celebrated *during* the following Masses: 5PM Saturday vigil Mass in English, 9:30AM Polish Mass, or 11AM Mass in English. *There will be no private Baptisms.* Those chosen as Godparents must be practicing, Confirmed Catholics whose lives reflect a commitment to the Catholic faith and to the role of Godparent. *Parents must register their child prior to the Baptism.* Parents of first children are required to receive instruction. **The sacrament of Baptism (Spanish) is celebrated during the 4PM Mass on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month.** Guidelines for pre-Baptismal registration and instruction are the same for all Baptisms.

Arrange *at least* six months before time.

May: Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary after each Sunday Mass

October: Decade of the Rosary after Sunday Masses

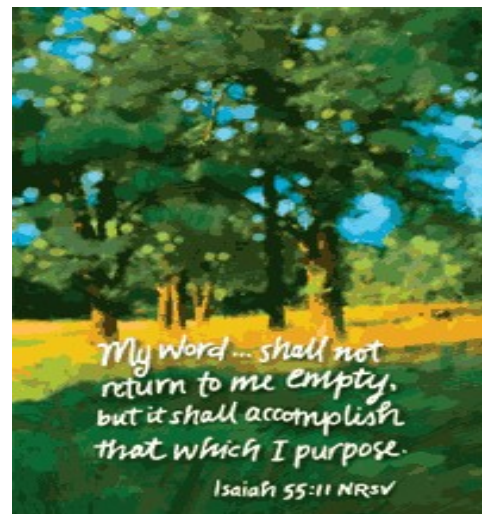

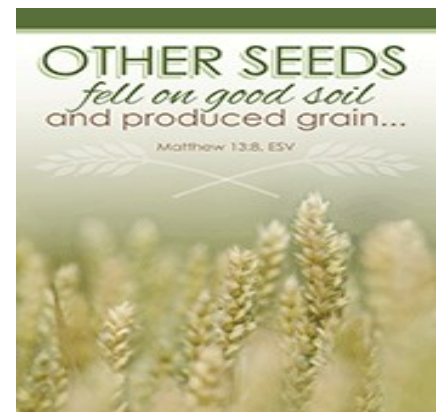
PRAYER of the WEEK



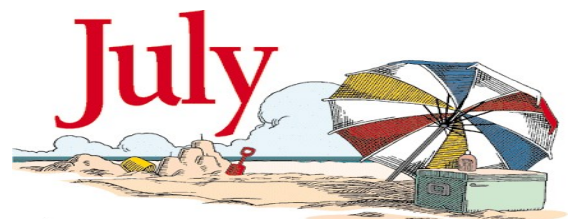

As we make our way through this unusual summer of 2020, we look to enjoy familiar summer pastimes that remain available to us. **One of**

these is gardening. Having spent months indoors, many of us broke free with the arrival of May and took our place on a long line leading to a garden center, where we were smitten with the abundance of dazzlingly-colored plants that would find a place in our gardens. On our daily walks, we pass homes with manicured lawns and porches festooned with decorative pots of lush blooms.

Much time, money, and care are spent on planting and sustaining a garden. The garden bed is fertilized for fail-proof success; each plant is placed in the light that will foster growth. Water is sprayed; weeds are plucked. Even the casual gardener is sure to remove any withered leaves. Nothing should harm any seedlings trying to thrive.

Today's parable of the sower comes at a perfect time of year. This parable serves as an invitation to look at our 'inner garden, **our soul**, and tend to it as carefully as a dedicated gardener protects and nourishes his/her seedlings. Today's Gospel should prompt each of us to ask, "How is the **soil** of my soul? What can I do to ensure that the **seed, the Word of God**, will take root in my life, grow strong, and spread? If we consider the gifts that God has given us, we realize that the only 'tools' that are needed lie within ourselves. First, we need to come to Mass with an attitude of readiness, an eagerness, to listen to the Word of God. It is good to arrive a bit early so as to settle down and present oneself to God. *Yes, Lord, I am here in both body and mind. My ears are open, and my mind is prepared to shut out any distractions. This is my time with you, Lord. I come here to praise You, to listen to You through Your Holy Word, to be nourished by You in the Eucharist.*

As we mature on our life's journey, we learn that we get more out of anything worthwhile if we put more *into* it. That which we do halfheartedly doesn't reap the fullest reward. This summer, a summer unlike any other, let us be good stewards of our 'inner garden. Let us feed our souls with a mixture containing equal parts of prayer, Scripture, humility, and charity. Let us remove the 'weeds' of our human nature through the sacrament of Penance. Let us nourish our souls with the Holy Eucharist.

Cherish your time in your garden. As you kneel in the quiet of your garden, spend some time in prayer as you **enjoy the warmth of the Son.**
